Call for Nominations for New Wardens

Every year, at this time, a notice is read at all Masses on three consecutive weekends asking for nominations to fill two vacant positions. Sean Donovan and Karl Santaguida are finishing their three-year term as church wardens this December and are eligible for reelection. Bradley Theriault is stepping down as warden and a successor will need to be elected for the remainder of his term (to end December 31, 2019). We are most grateful to these wardens for the service and guidance given to St. John Fisher Parish. Nominations will be accepted during the Weekend Masses of December 1/2. In order to qualify, nominees must be proposed by a parishioner and seconded by two other parishioners. Election will take place the next weekend, Dec 8/9 during the Weekend Masses. **Note:** To be eligible for church warden, a person must be at least 18 years of age, active in the parish, possess professional skills or administrative work experience and have a good reputation as a Catholic. He / She must be living within the civil boundaries of the parish. A church warden is an administrator of the material goods and property intended for the religious benefit of the parishioners. We encourage any eligible parishioner to stand for nomination as a way to engage and enrich our spiritual community through the contribution of your talents and time. As a steward of the church, your role is critical to the future success of our beloved St John Fisher Parish!
